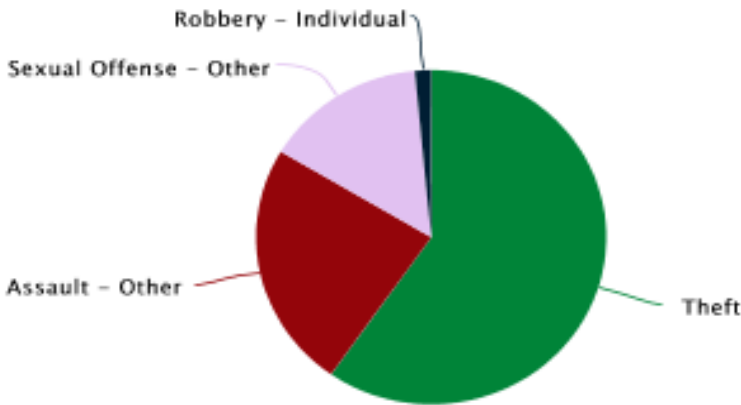
Part 1 Crimes by Day of Week



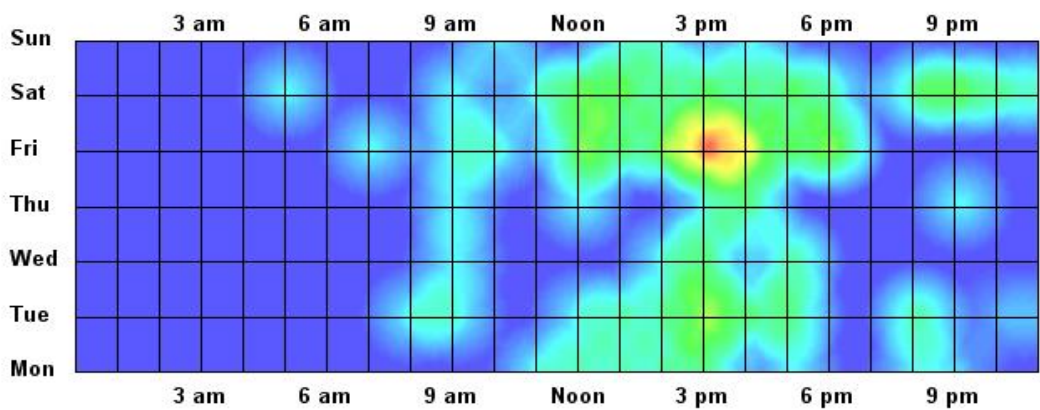
Traffic Accidents by Day of Week

Traffic Accident Highest Times

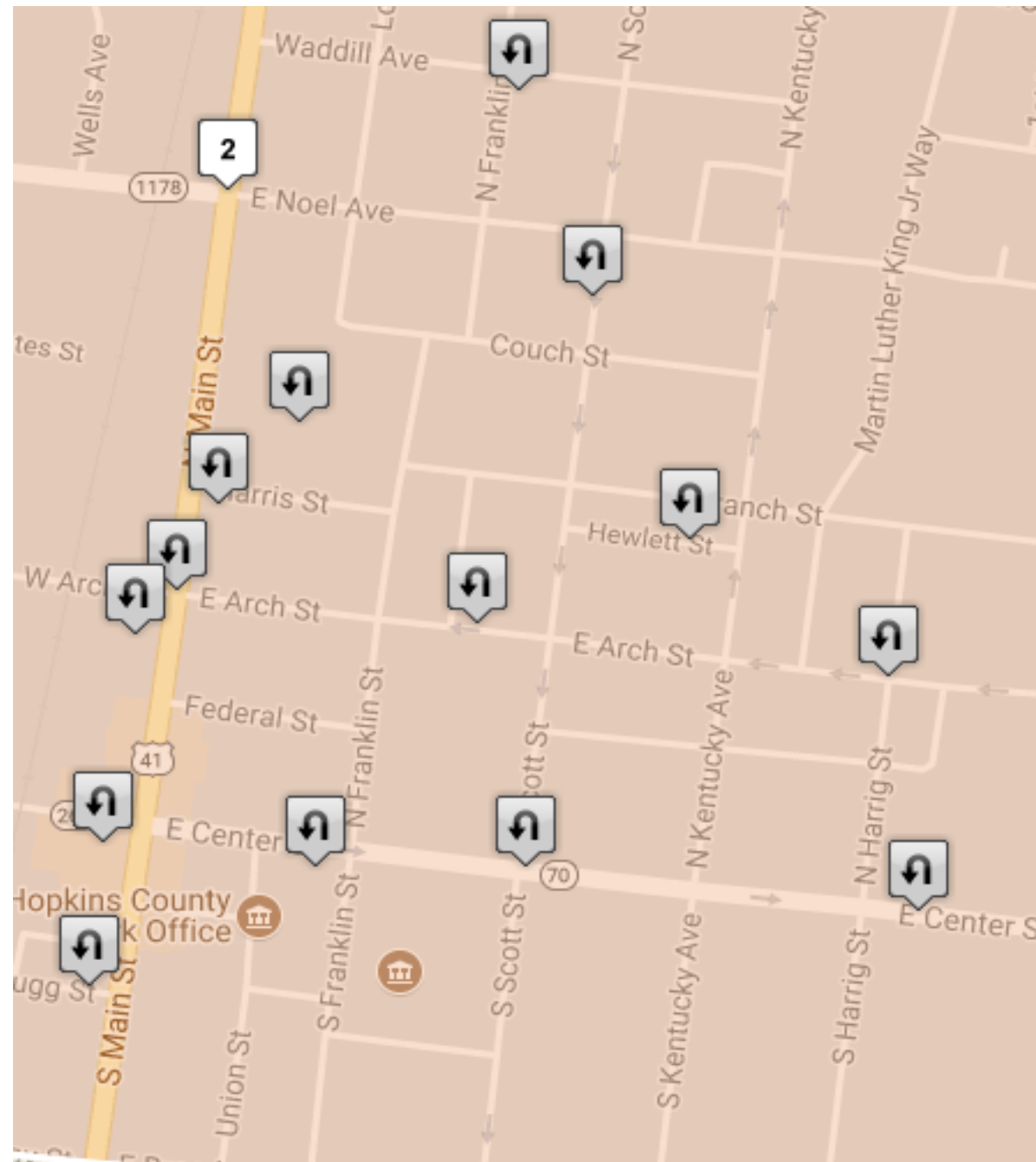

Traffic Accidents Highest Density



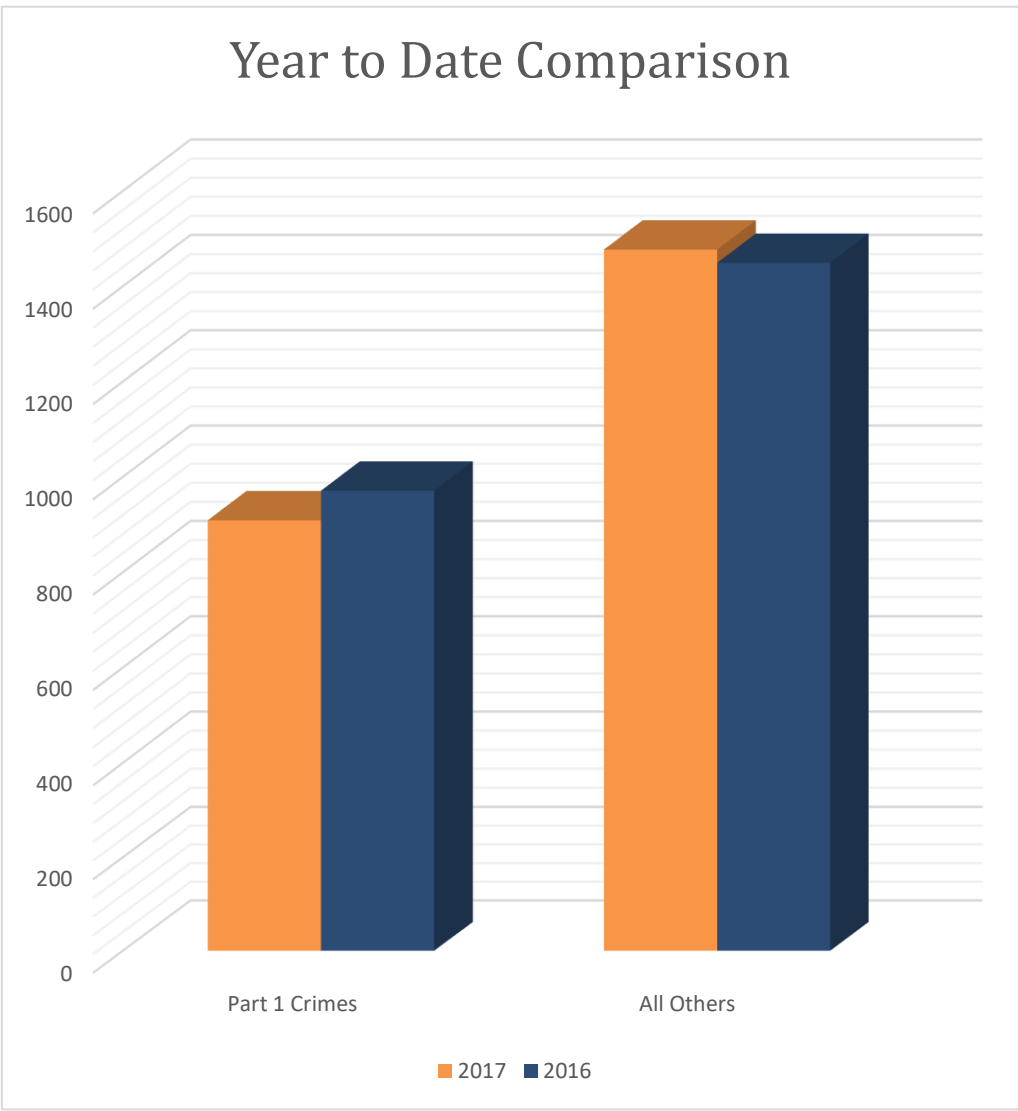
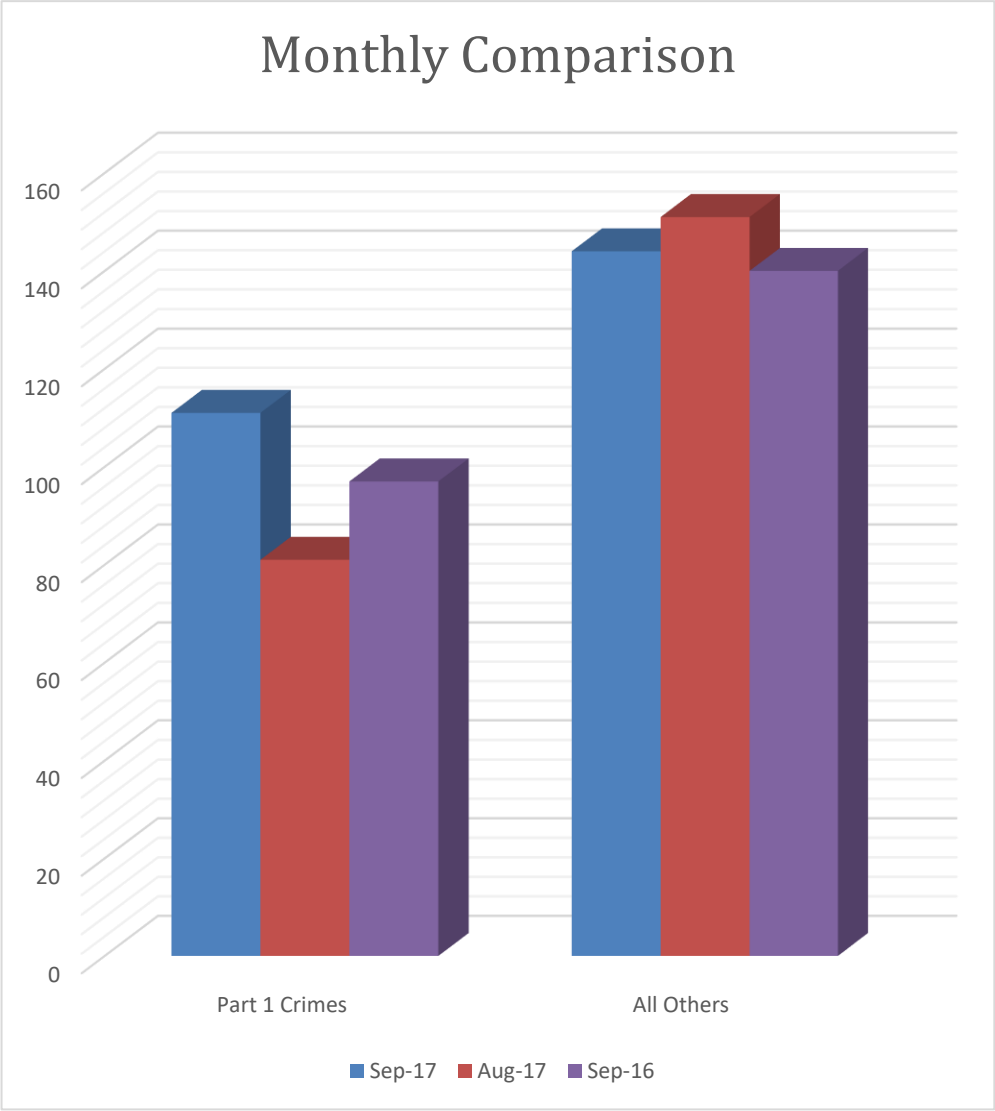

1. Appendix B to the code of Ordinances, City of Madisonville, Kentucky, passed on December 28, 1970, and the Official Map adopted therewith, as amended, are hereby amended insofar as same relates to approximately 6.756 acres of property located behind 1771 South Main Street, abutting the CSX railroad, from Rural Residential to General Commercial. For a description of the boundary of the area to be rezoned, see Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. The zoning classification of these properties is hereby changed from Rural Residential to General Commercial.
2. Any Ordinance in conflict with this Ordinance shall be and hereby is repealed.
