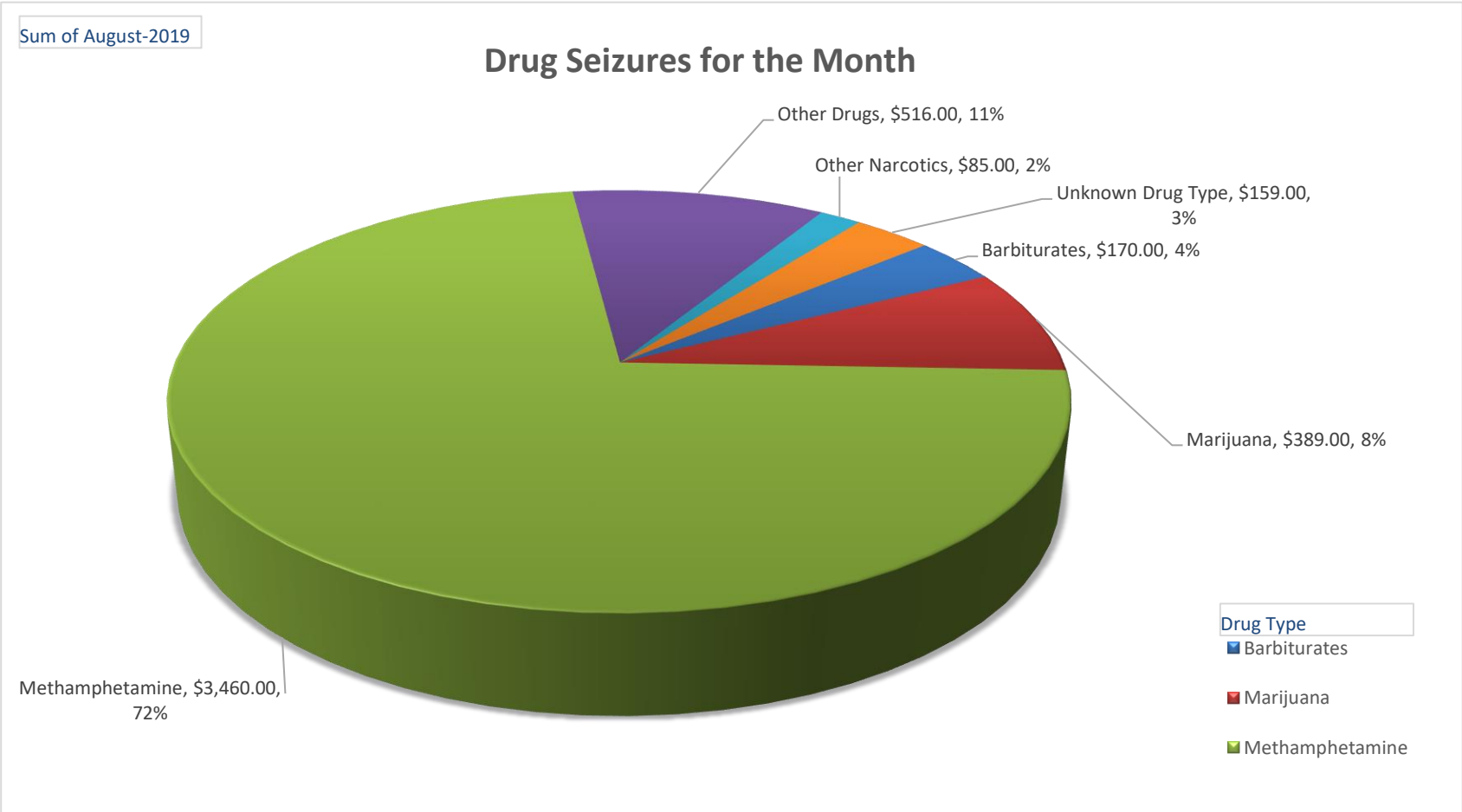

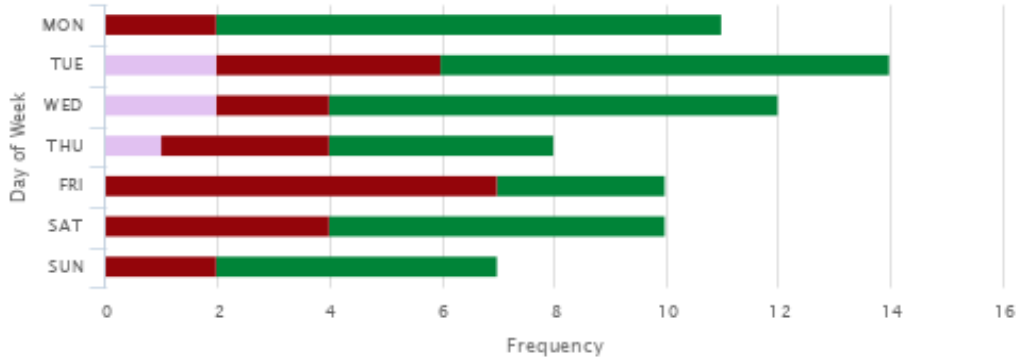

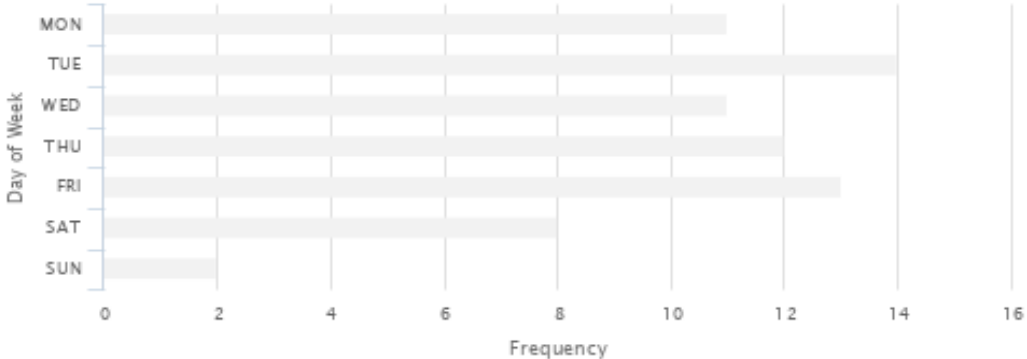

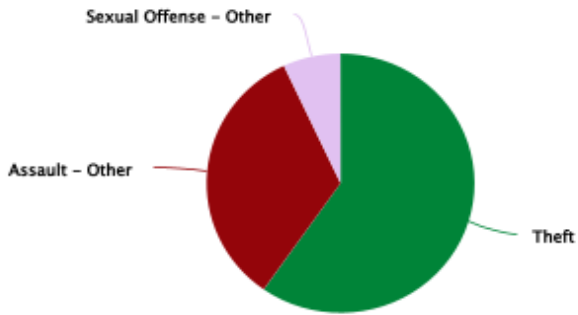
Part 1 Crimes by Day of Week



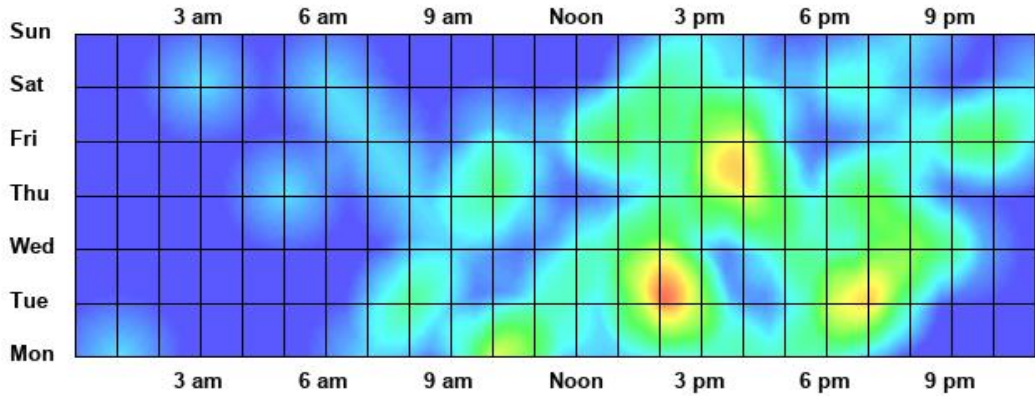
Traffic Accidents by Day of Week

Traffic Accident Highest Times

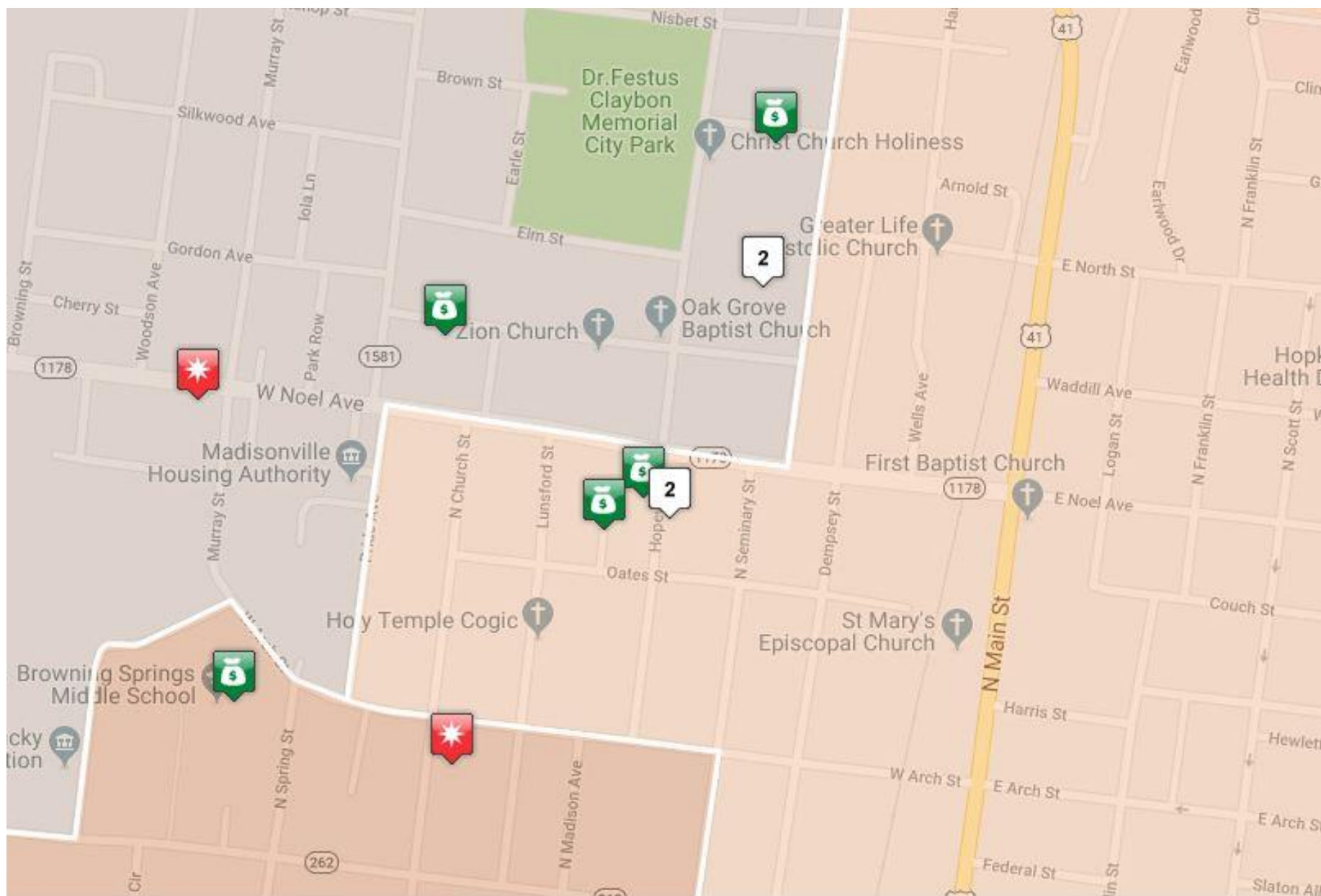

Part 1 Crimes Highest Density

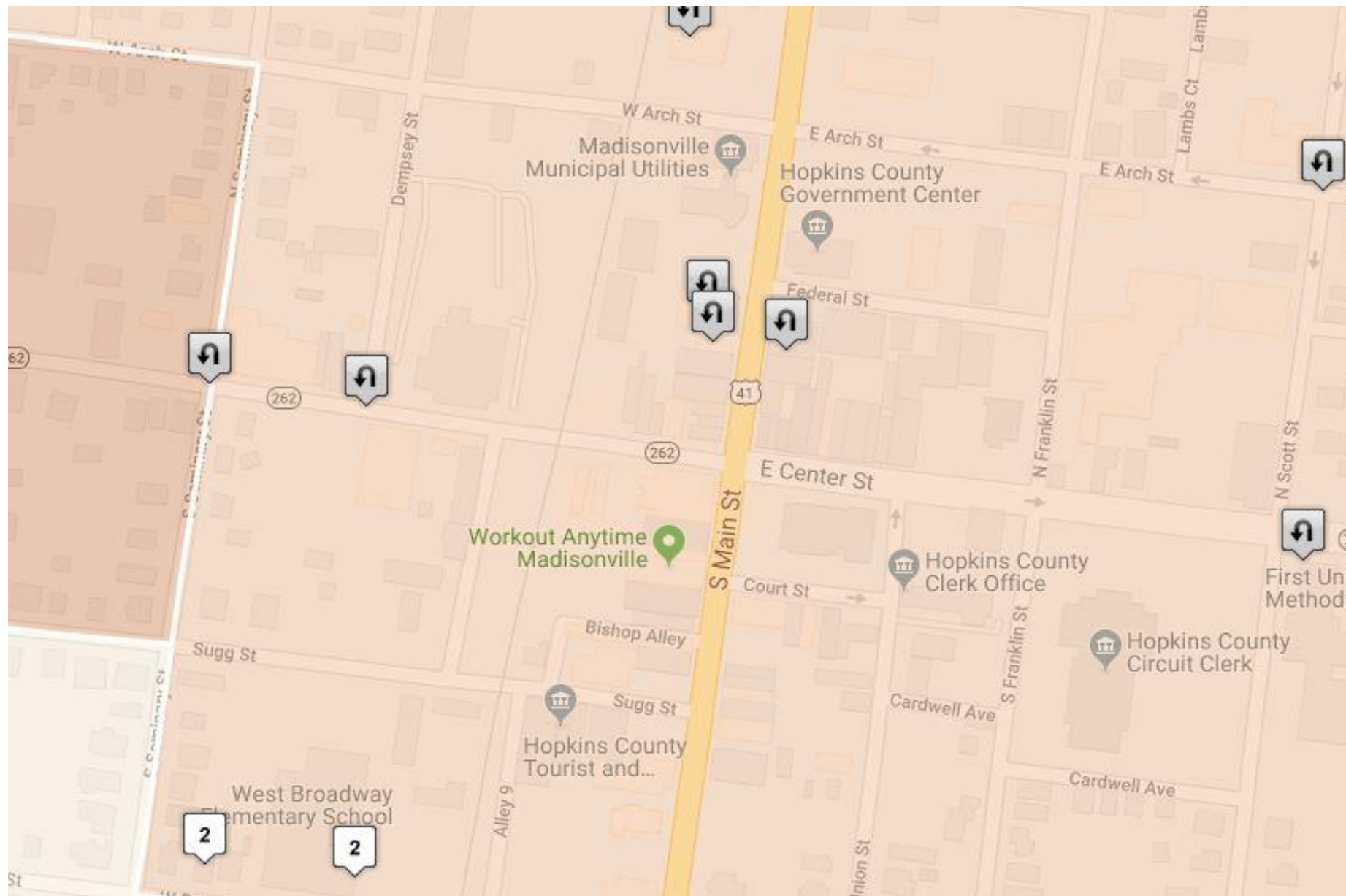

Traffic Accidents Highest Density



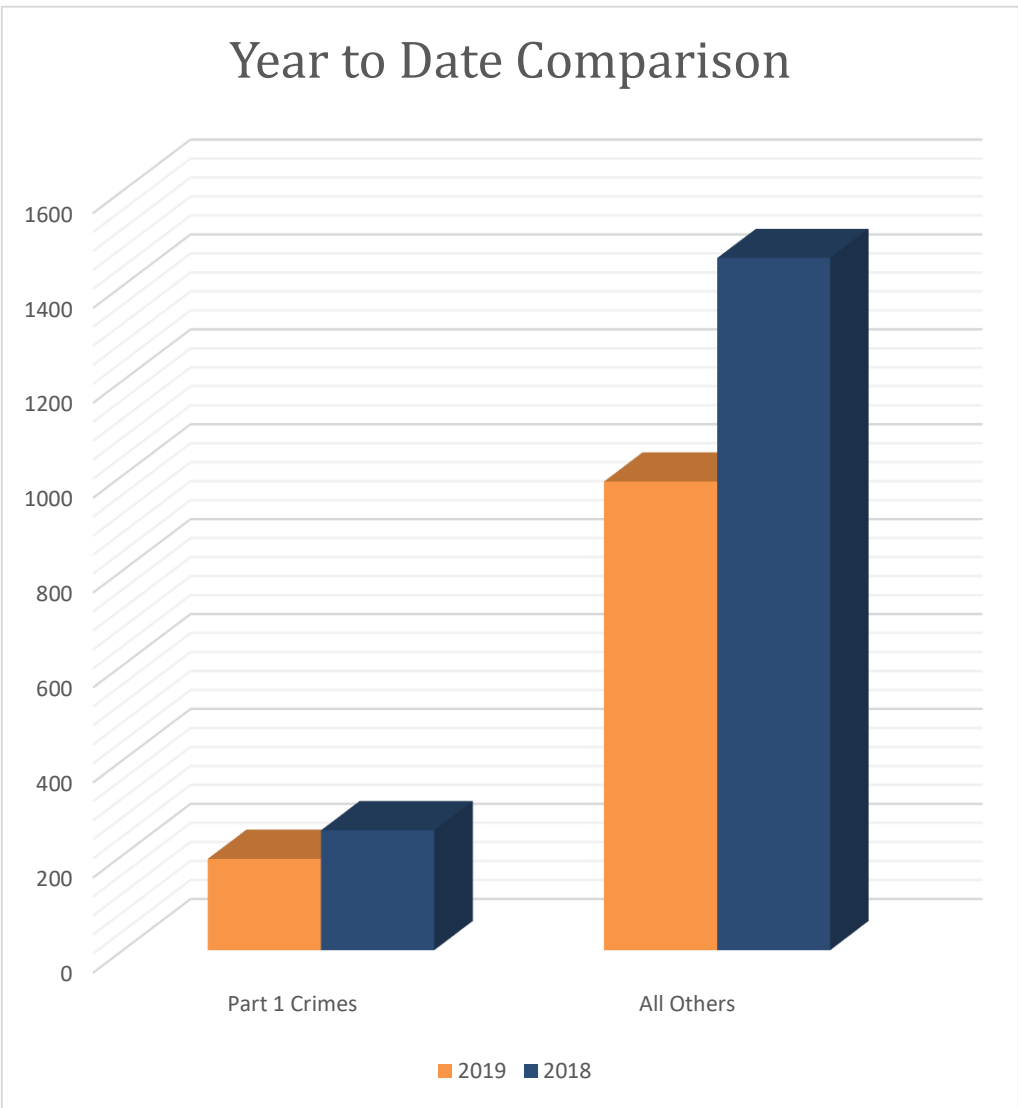
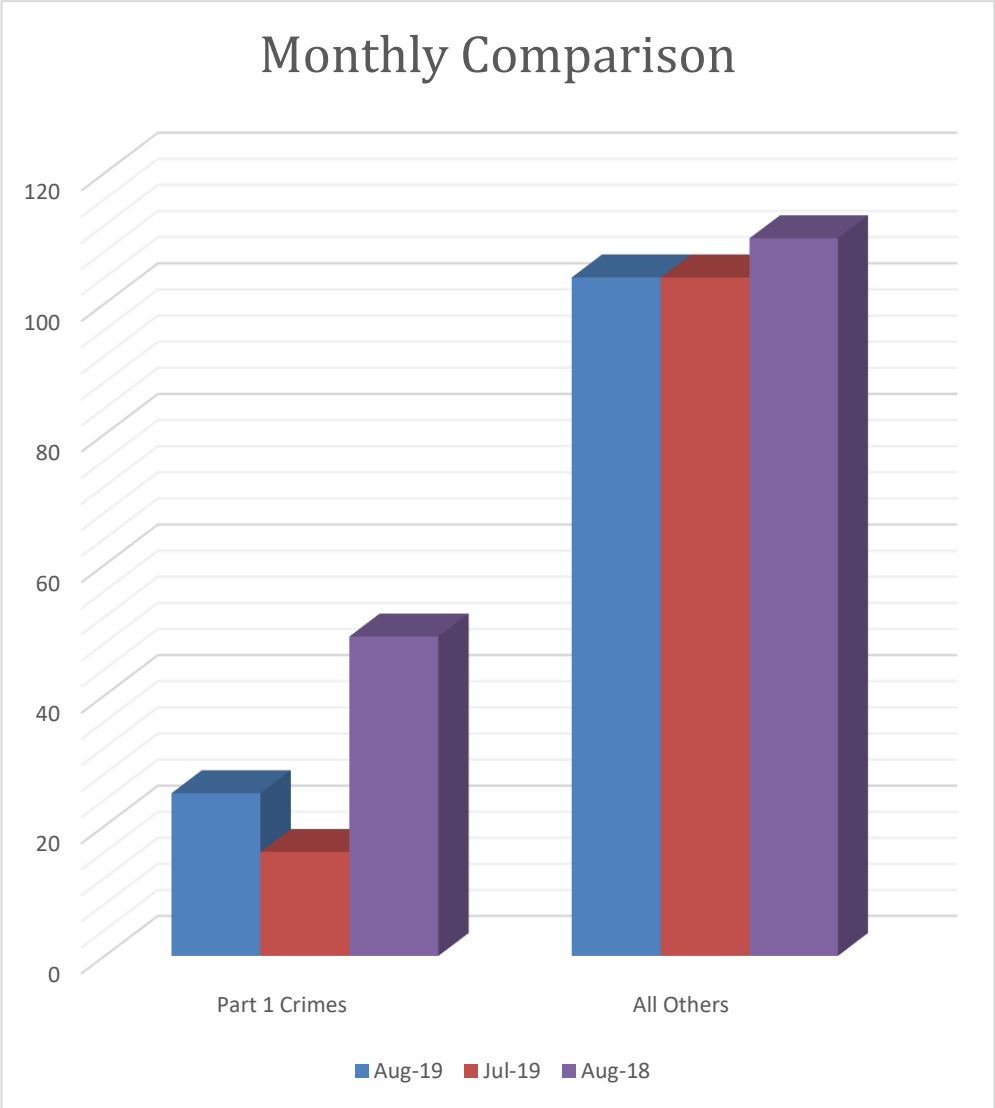

**CITY OF MADISONVILLE, KY
ORDINANCE O-2019-13**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 96 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE
CITY OF MADISONVILLE (RELATING TO PROPERTY TAX)**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF MADISONVILLE, KY, AS FOLLOWS:

§96.01 PROPERTY TO BE ASSESSED AND TAX LEVIED ANNUALLY.

All real and personal property within the corporate limits of the City subject to tax for the City purposes shall be assessed each year as provided by law and ad valorem taxes shall be levied thereon for city purposes.

§96.02 EFFECT ON EXISTING ORDINANCES.

Nothing in this ordinance shall be deemed to effect the validity of any annual tax levy ordinance or any ordinance levying a specific tax and all such ordinances shall remain in full force and effect under their respective terms and conditions.

§96.03 ADOPTING HOPKINS COUNTY ASSESSMENT.

The City does hereby adopt, approve, and elect to use the annual assessment of property prepared for Hopkins County for property situated within the corporate limits of the City as the basis of the ad valorem tax levied herein. The City Clerk shall notify the Commonwealth of Kentucky, Department of Revenue, and the Property Valuation Administrator of Hopkins County, Kentucky, immediately upon election of the City to adopt said assessment. Each year the City shall appropriate and pay to the office of the Hopkins County Property Valuation Administrator a sum for the use of said assessment as prescribed by law.

§96.04 ASSESSMENT DATE.

Pursuant to KRS 132.285, the assessment date for the City shall conform to the assessment date of Hopkins County, the time for levying the city tax rate, fiscal year, and any other dates that will enable the effective adoption of the county assessment, notwithstanding any statutory provisions to the contrary, are hereby designated to conform with the appropriate dates prescribed for the County by statute.

§96.05 DUE AND DELINQUENCY DATES.

(A) All taxes hereunder shall be due and payable on or before November 30, 2019 ~~[2018]~~. A discount of two percent (2%) shall be allowed on each tax bill for general purposes, if paid on or before October 31, 2019 ~~[2018]~~. Those tax bills remaining unpaid after November 30, 2019 ~~[2018]~~ shall be declared "Delinquent" and shall bear interest at a rate of twelve percent (12%) per annum, until paid.

(B) In addition thereto, a penalty of ten percent (10%) of the amount of tax for general assessment shall be added to said bill and collected, being the penalty for nonpayment when due.

§96.06 TAX STATEMENT.

Each year the Finance Director of the City shall prepare and mail a tax statement to each taxpayer

at his last known address.

§96.07 FINANCE DIRECTOR TO COLLECT TAXES.

(A) Except as provided herein, all ad valorem taxes levied by the City shall be collected by the Finance Director of the City in the manner and upon the terms prescribed by law.

(B) When the bill has been declared delinquent, the Finance Director shall then proceed with the Collection of the delinquent tax bills, penalty and interest as provided herein, and to enforce the payment of same by distraint or levy and sale of property as provided by law. The Finance Director will also report to the Council monthly the progress made in collecting delinquent taxes during the previous month.

(C) All ad valorem taxes levied against motor vehicles and/or watercraft may be collected by the Clerk of the Hopkins County Court. If such taxes are so collected, the City shall pay to the Clerk such sum as provided by law.

§96.08 AD VALOREM TAX RATES FOR 2019 ~~2018~~.

The ad valorem rates for 2019 [~~2018~~] shall be as follows:

(A) The tax rate for real estate shall be \$.122 for each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of assessed valuation;

(B) The tax rate for motor vehicles and/or watercraft shall be \$.15 for each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of assessed valuation.

(C) The tax rate for all other tangible personal property shall be \$0.1706 [~~\$.2152~~] for each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of assessed valuation; and

§96.09 USE OF REVENUE

All monies derived herein shall be deposited in the General Fund of the City and shall be used and expended in defraying current, general, and incidental expenses of the City.

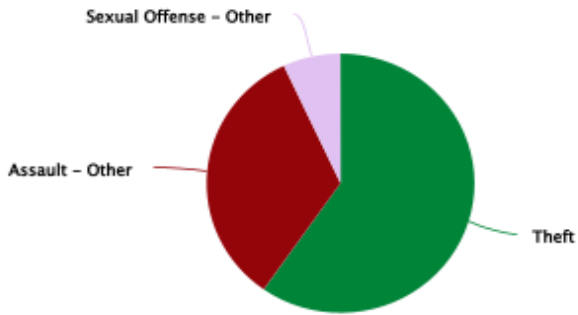
Part 1 Crimes by Day of Week



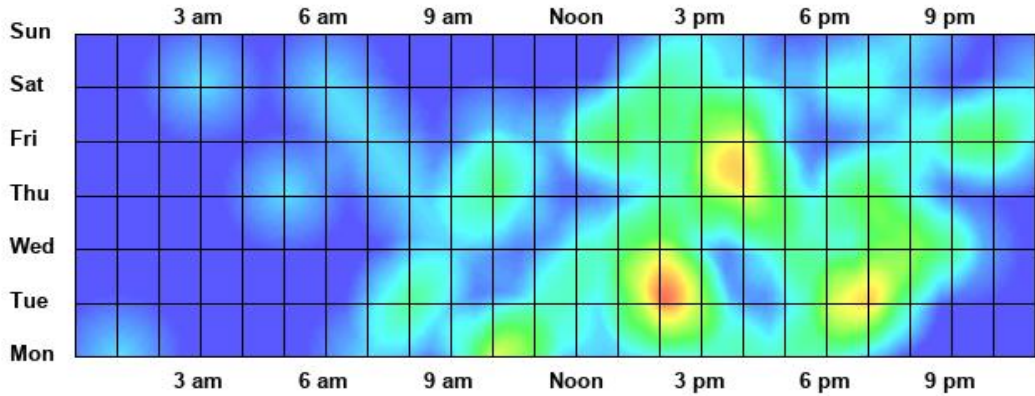
Traffic Accidents by Day of Week

Traffic Accident Highest Times

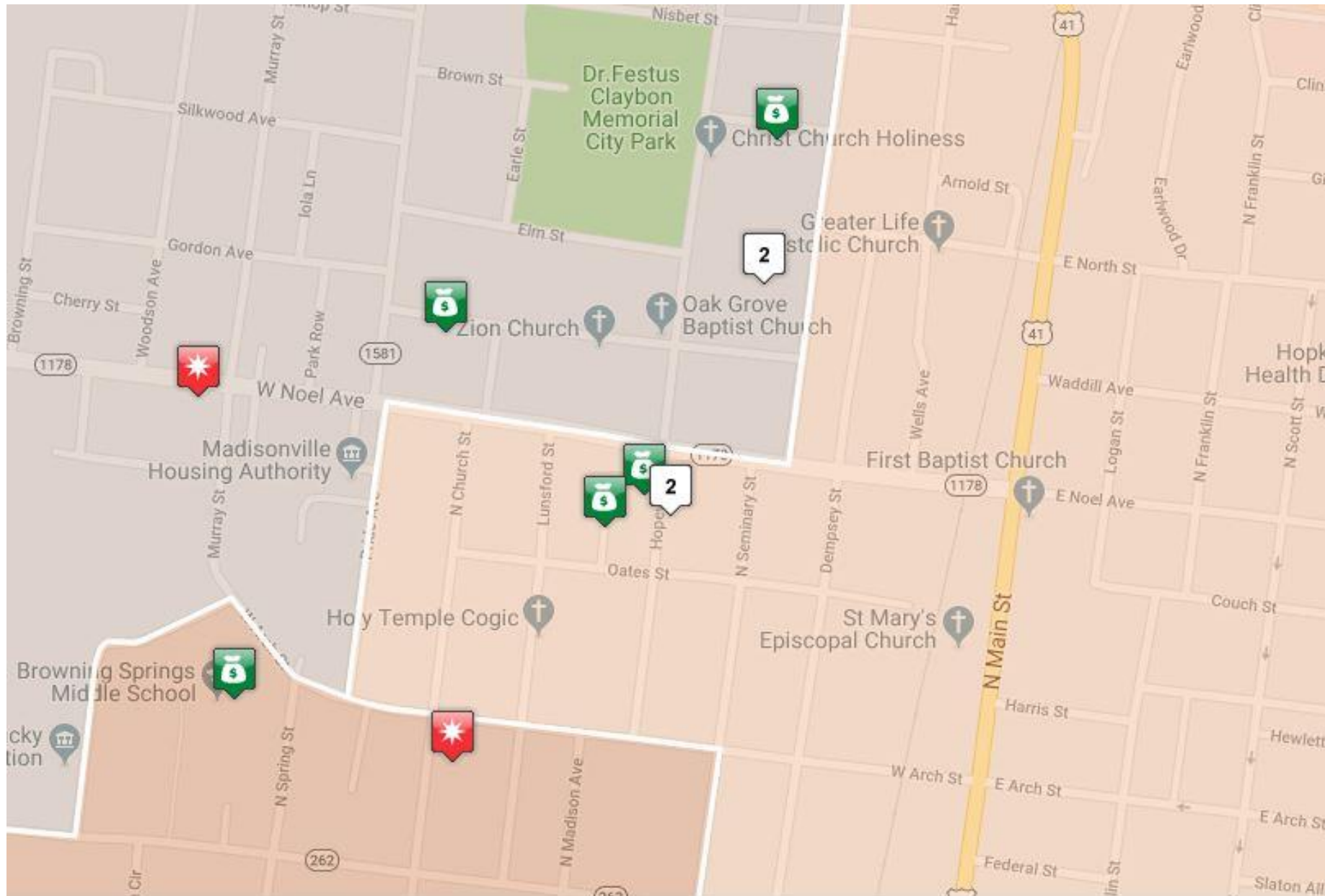

Part 1 Crimes Highest Density

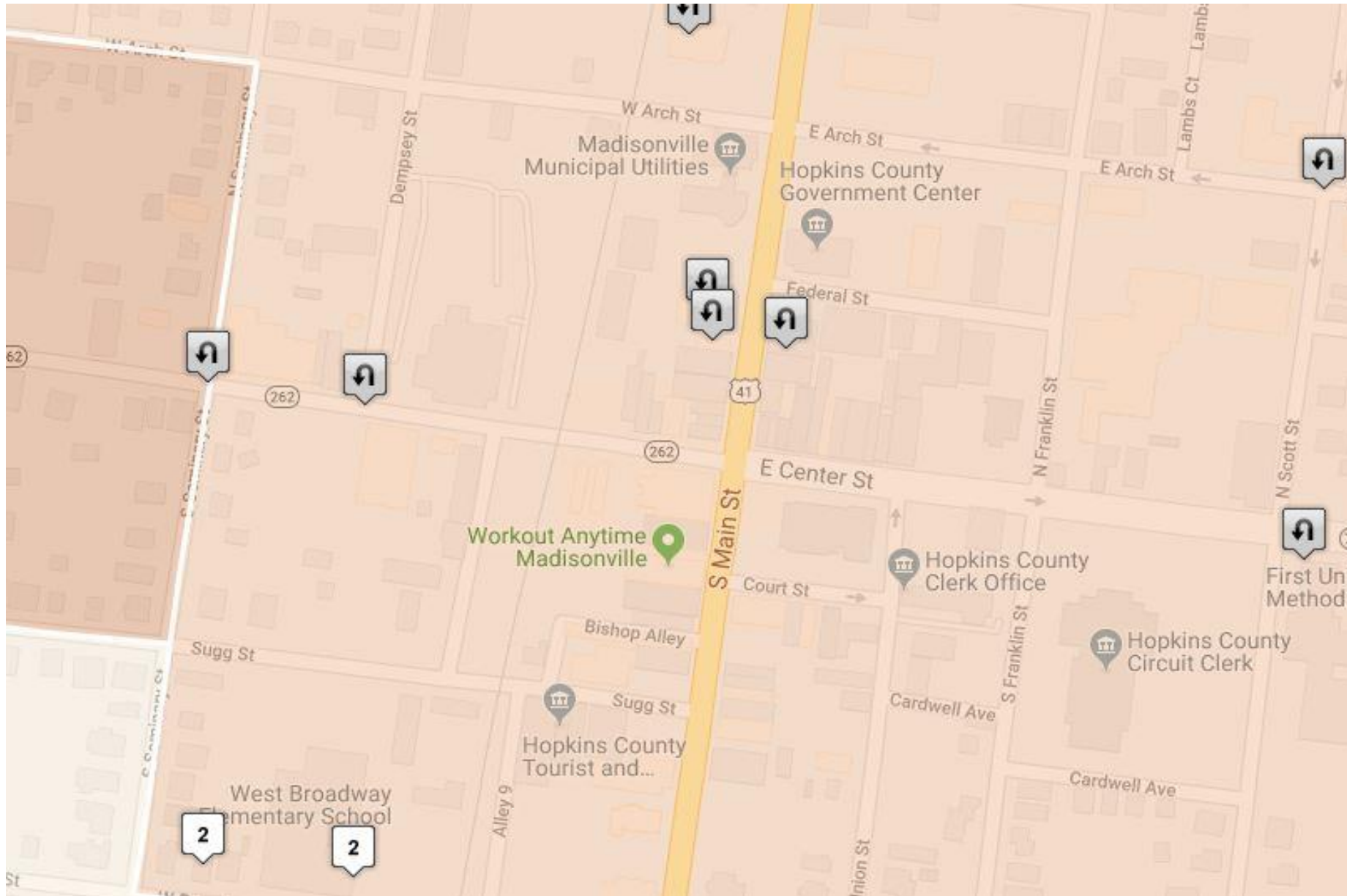

Traffic Accidents Highest Density



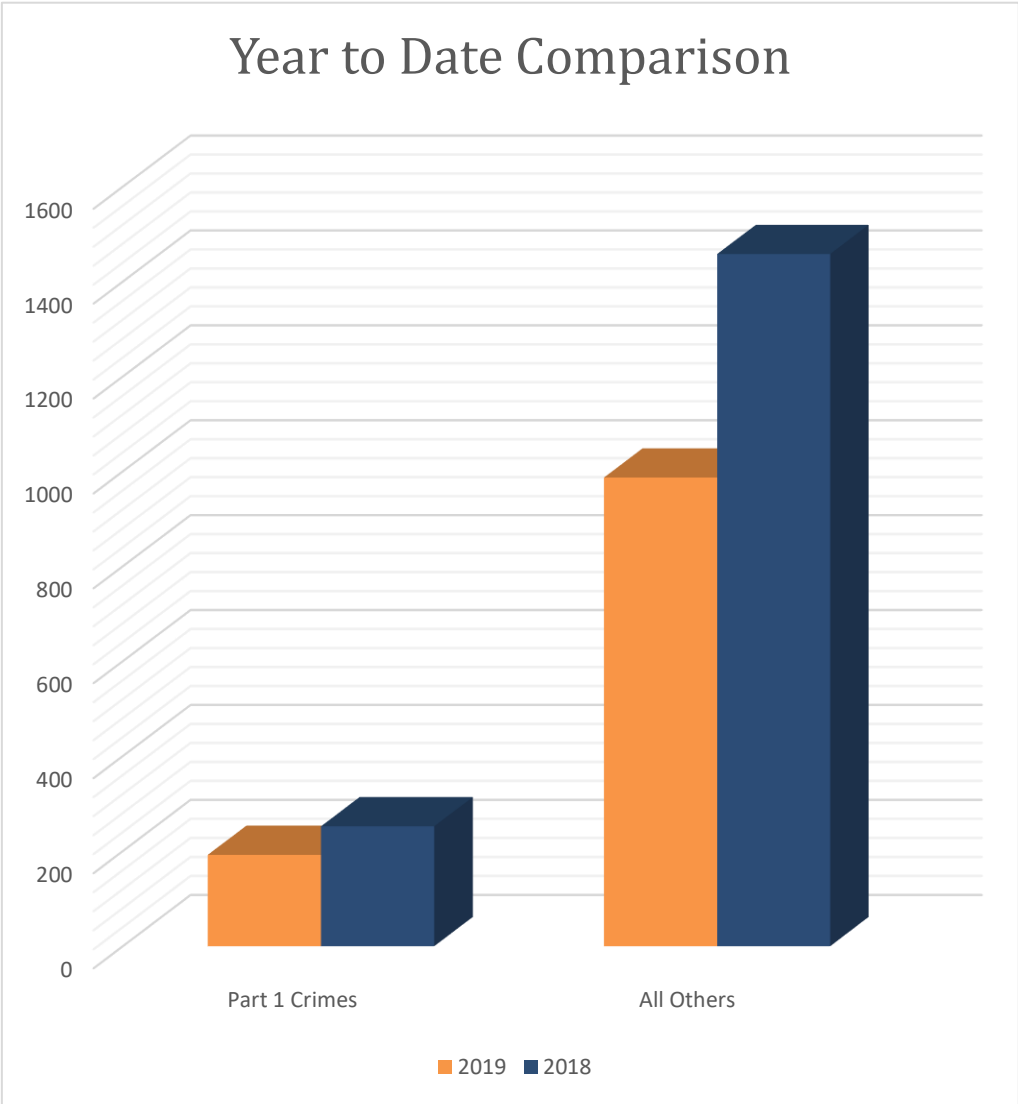
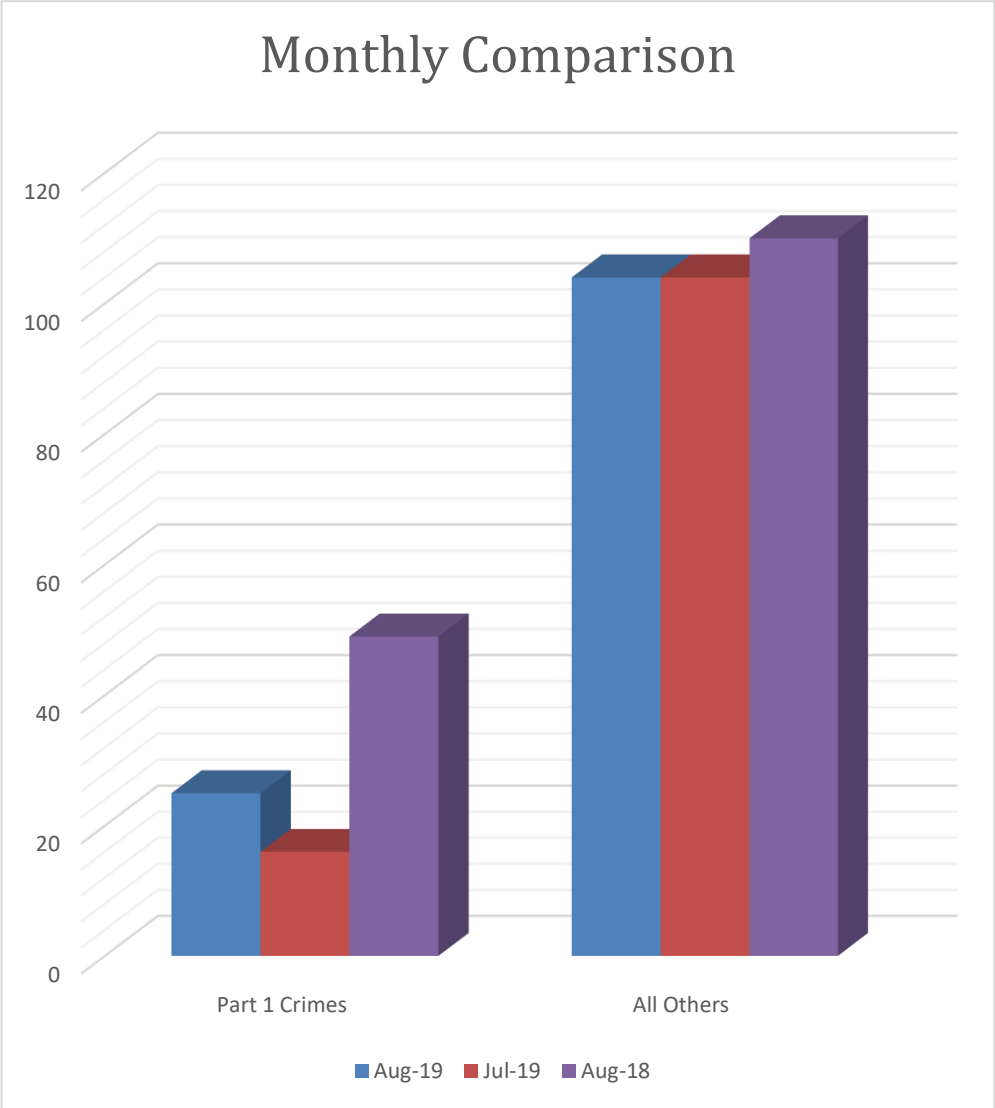

**CITY OF MADISONVILLE, KY
ORDINANCE O-2019-13**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 96 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE
CITY OF MADISONVILLE (RELATING TO PROPERTY TAX)**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF MADISONVILLE, KY, AS FOLLOWS:

§96.01 PROPERTY TO BE ASSESSED AND TAX LEVIED ANNUALLY.

All real and personal property within the corporate limits of the City subject to tax for the City purposes shall be assessed each year as provided by law and ad valorem taxes shall be levied thereon for city purposes.

§96.02 EFFECT ON EXISTING ORDINANCES.

Nothing in this ordinance shall be deemed to effect the validity of any annual tax levy ordinance or any ordinance levying a specific tax and all such ordinances shall remain in full force and effect under their respective terms and conditions.

§96.03 ADOPTING HOPKINS COUNTY ASSESSMENT.

The City does hereby adopt, approve, and elect to use the annual assessment of property prepared for Hopkins County for property situated within the corporate limits of the City as the basis of the ad valorem tax levied herein. The City Clerk shall notify the Commonwealth of Kentucky, Department of Revenue, and the Property Valuation Administrator of Hopkins County, Kentucky, immediately upon election of the City to adopt said assessment. Each year the City shall appropriate and pay to the office of the Hopkins County Property Valuation Administrator a sum for the use of said assessment as prescribed by law.

§96.04 ASSESSMENT DATE.

Pursuant to KRS 132.285, the assessment date for the City shall conform to the assessment date of Hopkins County, the time for levying the city tax rate, fiscal year, and any other dates that will enable the effective adoption of the county assessment, notwithstanding any statutory provisions to the contrary, are hereby designated to conform with the appropriate dates prescribed for the County by statute.

§96.05 DUE AND DELINQUENCY DATES.

(A) All taxes hereunder shall be due and payable on or before November 30, 2019 ~~[2018]~~. A discount of two percent (2%) shall be allowed on each tax bill for general purposes, if paid on or before October 31, 2019 ~~[2018]~~. Those tax bills remaining unpaid after November 30, 2019 ~~[2018]~~ shall be declared "Delinquent" and shall bear interest at a rate of twelve percent (12%) per annum, until paid.

(B) In addition thereto, a penalty of ten percent (10%) of the amount of tax for general assessment shall be added to said bill and collected, being the penalty for nonpayment when due.

§96.06 TAX STATEMENT.

Each year the Finance Director of the City shall prepare and mail a tax statement to each taxpayer

at his last known address.

§96.07 FINANCE DIRECTOR TO COLLECT TAXES.

(A) Except as provided herein, all ad valorem taxes levied by the City shall be collected by the Finance Director of the City in the manner and upon the terms prescribed by law.

(B) When the bill has been declared delinquent, the Finance Director shall then proceed with the Collection of the delinquent tax bills, penalty and interest as provided herein, and to enforce the payment of same by distraint or levy and sale of property as provided by law. The Finance Director will also report to the Council monthly the progress made in collecting delinquent taxes during the previous month.

(C) All ad valorem taxes levied against motor vehicles and/or watercraft may be collected by the Clerk of the Hopkins County Court. If such taxes are so collected, the City shall pay to the Clerk such sum as provided by law.

§96.08 AD VALOREM TAX RATES FOR 2019 ~~2018~~.

The ad valorem rates for 2019 [~~2018~~] shall be as follows:

(A) The tax rate for real estate shall be \$.122 for each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of assessed valuation;

(B) The tax rate for motor vehicles and/or watercraft shall be \$.15 for each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of assessed valuation.

(C) The tax rate for all other tangible personal property shall be \$0.1706 [~~\$.2152~~] for each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of assessed valuation; and

§96.09 USE OF REVENUE

All monies derived herein shall be deposited in the General Fund of the City and shall be used and expended in defraying current, general, and incidental expenses of the City.

The foregoing Ordinance is read to and presented to a regular meeting of the City Council of Madisonville, Kentucky, for first reading on the 3rd day of September, 2019 and the second reading on the 16th day of September, 2019. Motion was made by , seconded by , that the Ordinance be adopted as the law of the City of Madisonville, Kentucky, to be effective upon publication, as required by law.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 159 OF THE CITY OF MADISONVILLE CODE OF ORDINANCES RELATING TO THE DESIGNATION OF A HISTORIC DISTRICT

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF MADISONVILLE, KY, AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, the City of Madisonville previously adopted Ordinance No. 00-06, currently codified as Chapter 159 of the City of Madisonville Code of Ordinances as amended by Ordinance No. 01-03, relating to the establishment of a Historic District Commission, the designation of a Historic District and Landmarks, and setting forth the procedures to be followed before making alterations to the exterior part of a building or structure located within the Historic District that is visible to the public or any proposal for the demolition thereof; and

WHEREAS, Section 159.05(A) of the City of Madisonville Code of Ordinances provides that the Historic District Commission recommend to the City Council the designation of historic districts and individual landmarks, and the City Council may make these designations by the enactment of ordinances; and

WHEREAS, the Commission following a public hearing has made a recommendation to the City Council that the boundaries of the Historic District be modified from a previous designation and the City Council is in agreement with the Historic District Commission's recommendations;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it hereby ordained by the City Council of the City of Madisonville as follows:

The Historic District of the City of Madisonville shall be as shown on the aerial photograph attached herewith, the provisions of which are incorporated herein by reference. Any previous designation inconsistent herewith is hereby repealed.

THROUGH COMPETITIVE NEGOTIATIONS FOR USE AT THE MADISONVILLE
REGIONAL AIRPORT**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF MADISONVILLE, KY, AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, the City of Madisonville working in conjunction with the Madisonville Regional Airport entered into a contract for the construction of new hangers at the Madisonville Regional Airport; and

WHEREAS, construction activities have disturbed the soil near the existing hangers making it difficult for planes to safely enter and exit from the hangers; and

WHEREAS, the Madisonville Regional Airport has lost rental income from the affected hangers and there has been a corresponding reduction of fuel sales at the Airport; and

WHEREAS, it is anticipated that the construction project will not be completed before the asphalt plants close for the season on or about November 1, 2019; and

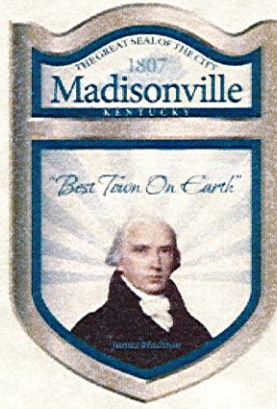

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council accepts and awards the bid to sell Mack Truck 1 for \$200,750.00 to Fleet Force New Way; Mack Truck 2 for \$204,150.00 to Fleet Force New Way and Mack Truck 3 for \$223,510.00 to Dependable Disposal.
