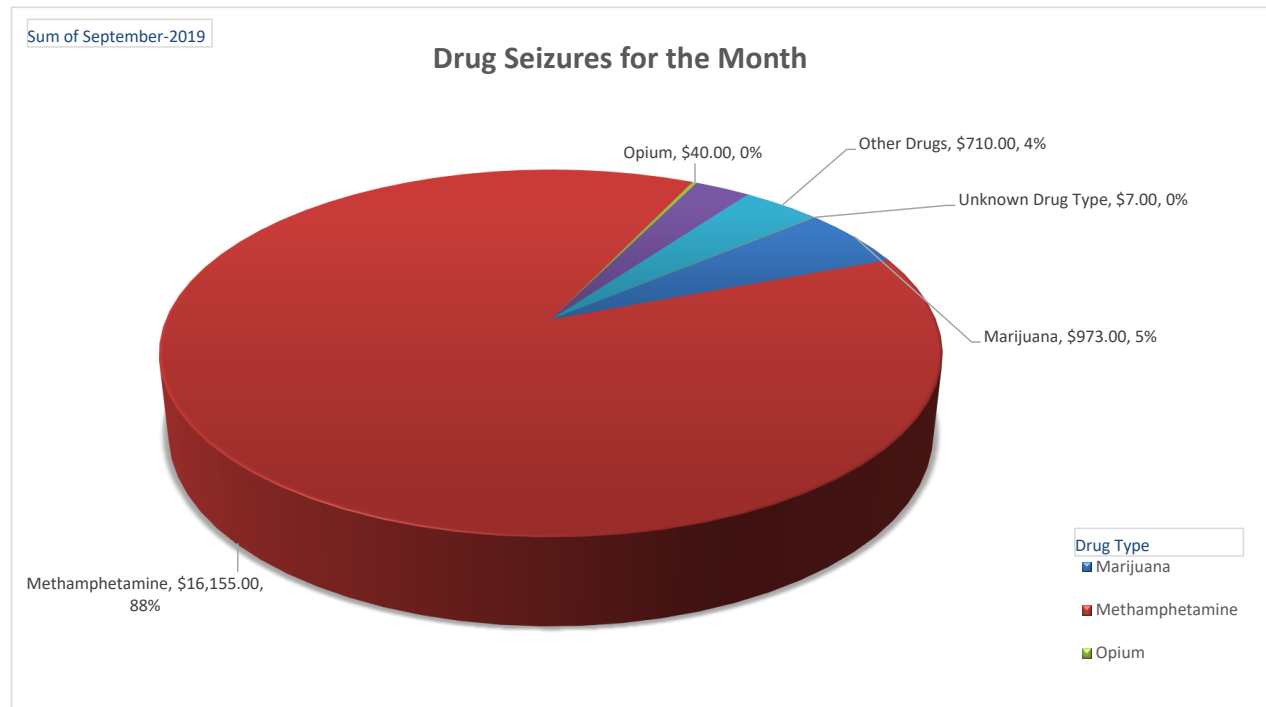

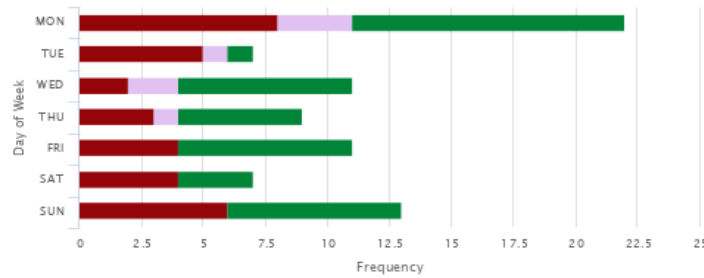

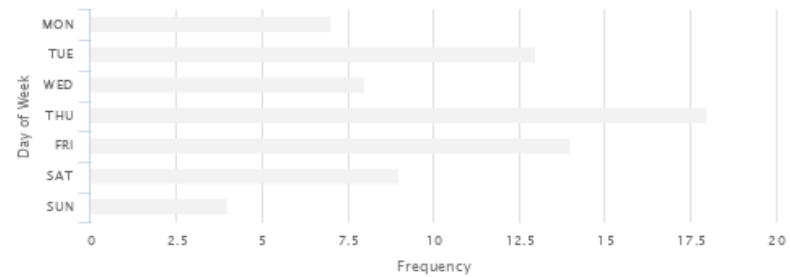

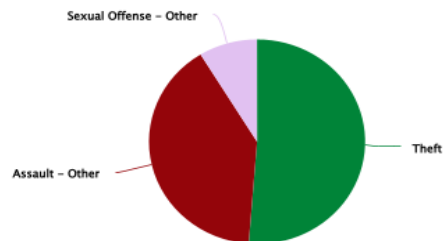
Part 1 Crimes by Day of Week



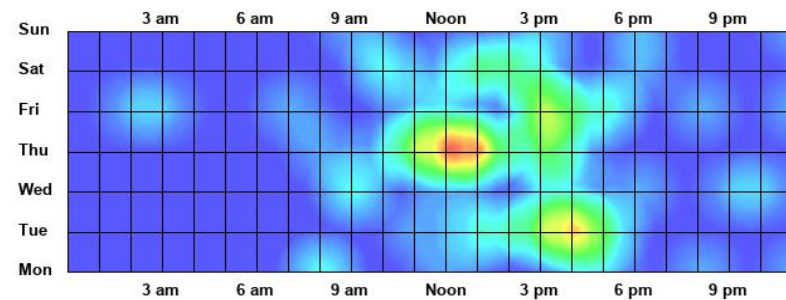
Traffic Accidents by Day of Week

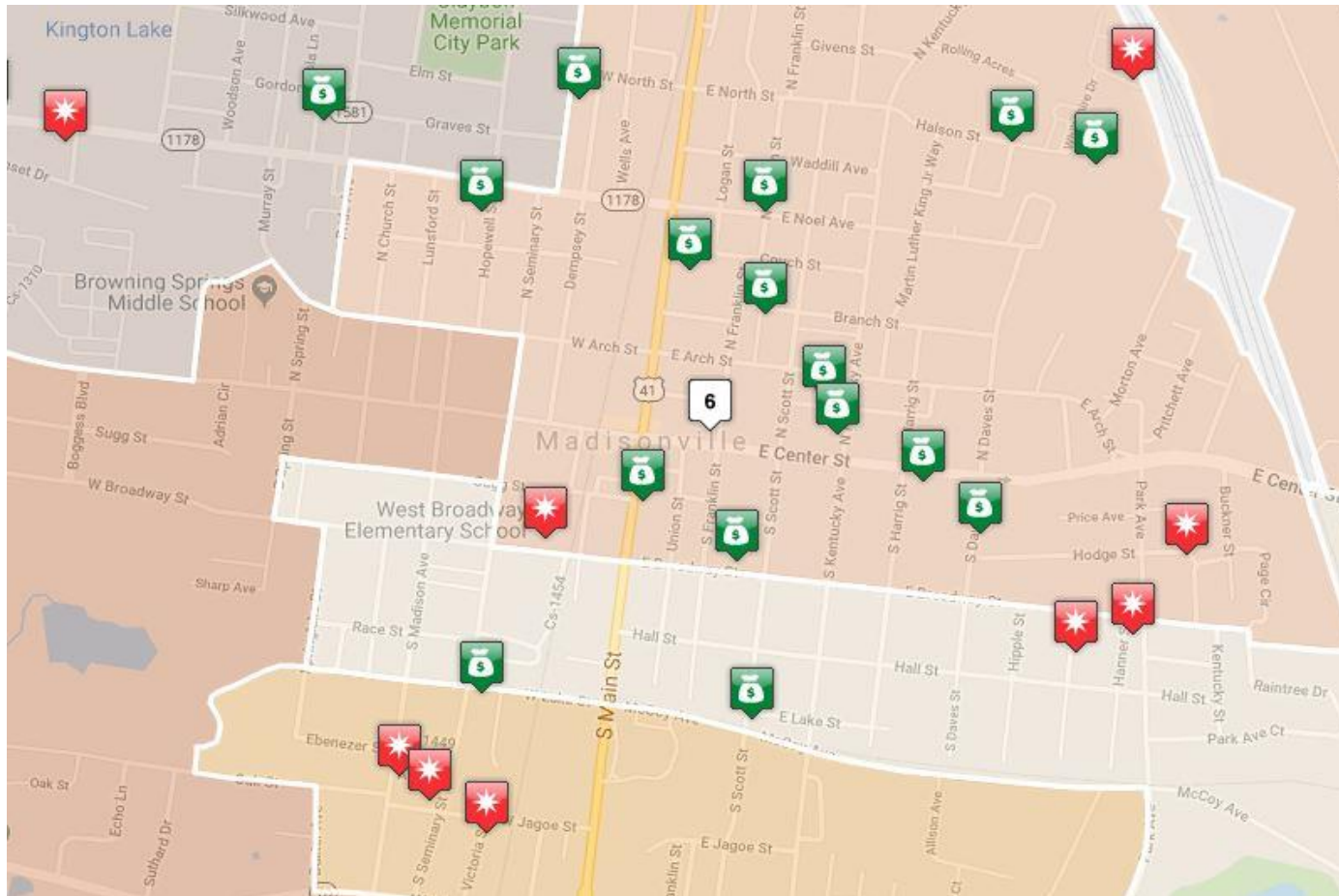
