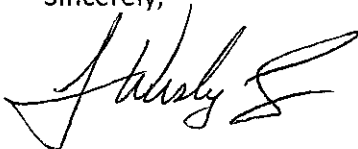

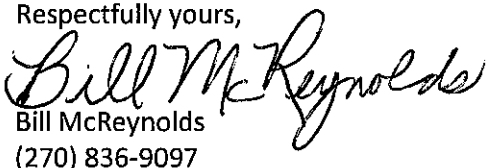
To Whom It May Concern,

I am Anthony L. Smith and I am submitting this letter seeking to fill the remaining months of the ward 6 City Council position of Bobby Johnson.

I have twice campaigned and sought the position via our Democratic election process. In the first effort I was defeated by Bill Smith the incumbent. After Bill Smith retired from the position I sought it again. In the 2nd effort I attended every council and committee hearing from about March of 2016 until the election in November of the same year. I attended every meeting of the new Tourism Advisory Board without being an appointed member through late 2016. Challenger Bobby Johnson came out on top. In neither election was I defeated by overwhelming numbers. Because of the 2 efforts I have met in person many of the constituents of Ward 6 personally throughout the entirety of the Ward due to the door to door campaign efforts I made.

With my creation and management of now 5 businesses in Madisonville I have created many jobs and opportunities going back to 1985. The first business was a humble 2 person operation which I sold to others so that I could have the funds to create my 2nd business, Blades Hair salon which has operated and employed since 1986. In a divorce settlement, my ex wife took total control of the business. She transferred the business name, good will and reputation to one of our first employees Elizabeth Oldham in about 2008. Elizabeth took off running with the business turning it into the one it is today, Blades Salon and Day Spa. She has had great success, still an employer and just weeks ago was named the co-recipient of the Lyons Club Woman of the year.

I opened next the 1st location of Father & Sons Liquors in 1991, the 2nd liquor store to open in Madisonville in more than 50 years. This business took off quickly and led to the opening of a second location. The previous owner of the 2nd location had failed in his entrepreneurial efforts and lost the business due to bankruptcy. It is extremely difficult to find success in a previously failed business. I rebuilt the stores inventory, repaired the equipment, regained and surpassed the previous stores annual sales to at that time to eventually employ in total annually more than 20 people, with highest annual sales of around 2 million dollars generating both payroll tax, occupational tax, property tax, sales tax and more revenues for the city of Madisonville. I sold F&S Liquors 7 years ago, it remains open and still provides employment for local citizens.

Between the years that I created F&S Liquors #1 and the acquisition of #2, I opened and operated the National Franchise, the General Nutrition Center for 10 years in Madisonville. After I sold it back to the company in approximately 2006 it remains open and is an employer still today.

Lastly, I have created a Real Estate Investment firm, LongView Development. I purchase, sell and rent properties in Madisonville and Hopkins county. With LongView I bought a dilapidated Strip Mall located at 101 41A. I renovated and repaired the eyesore, and that is still on going. I increased the tenants from 2 to 5. My renovations caused 1 of the original 5 to stop their process of removing their business from Madisonville. Each of the newly occupied business has employees, sales and services, again, increasing the tax revenues for the City of Madisonville. On the residential side of the LongView, I have been part of or wholly responsible for the acquisition of properties abandoned and in need of repair. That process has involved the purchase of material and services from various local supply companies, contractors and sub contractors. Through that I have created some temporary employment through short term labor to some of greatest need local citizens. I am also a licensed Real Estate professional with Ken Gibson Realtors.

To list my involvement with the citizens and the betterment of Madisonville goes back many years spanning back to the Bill Cox administration. I was instrumental in the CFACS effort to make alcohol

sales legal again. The successful conclusion of that campaign has created many businesses, jobs and increased tax revenues throughout the city. I was involved in the firsts of several events in Madisonville. I led and operated the first two beer Gardens in the Taste of Madisonville events, now known as Friday Night Live. I was involved in the first few Picnic in The Park events. I was involved in and led the first 2 public wine tastings in Madisonville. I was instrumental in pushing for the tennis court repairs at Cherry Park and the creation of FootGolf in our City Park. I have been involved in community development from the first New Cities plan, and the 2nd graduating class of the Leadership Greater Madisonville group. My charitable efforts range across the board, from fund raising for the YMCA to the MDA and several more. I still am involved in various charities in Madisonville and the County, preferring contributions that affect the poorest of us. From Landons Hope, to the Light of Chance/Breathe programs especially.

Lastly, I am a man who has his feet set squarely on both sides of the tracks with friends from the most affluent and powerful, to the poorest and least influential, I am known to all from those extremes and through every strata of income and community involvement between.

I am proudly in social programs left leaning, yet fiscally a conservative. I believe the council needs that as a balance.

If I am chosen to fill the remainder of Bobby Johnson's term, it is my intention to file as an Independent for the next term. Thank you for your consideration,

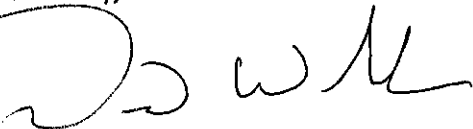
Dear Kevin Cotton:
