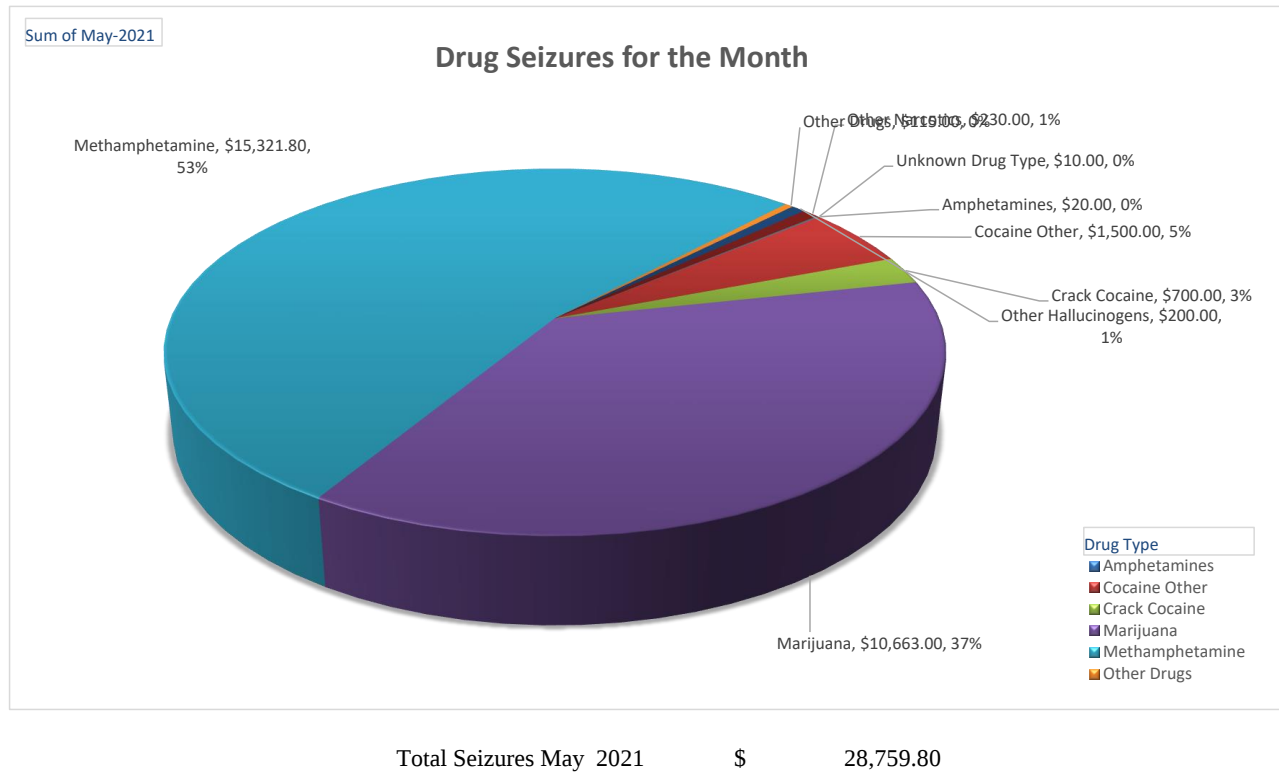

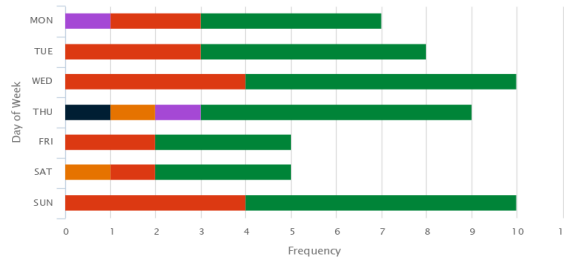

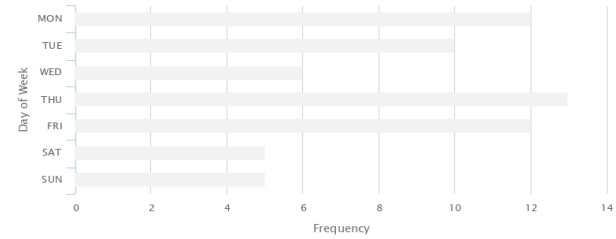

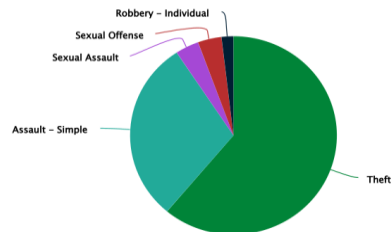
Part 1 Crimes by Day of Week



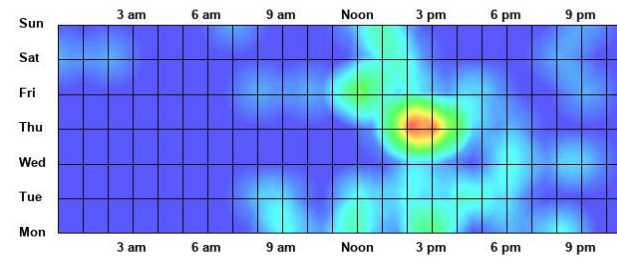
Traffic Accidents by Day of Week

Traffic Accident Highest Times



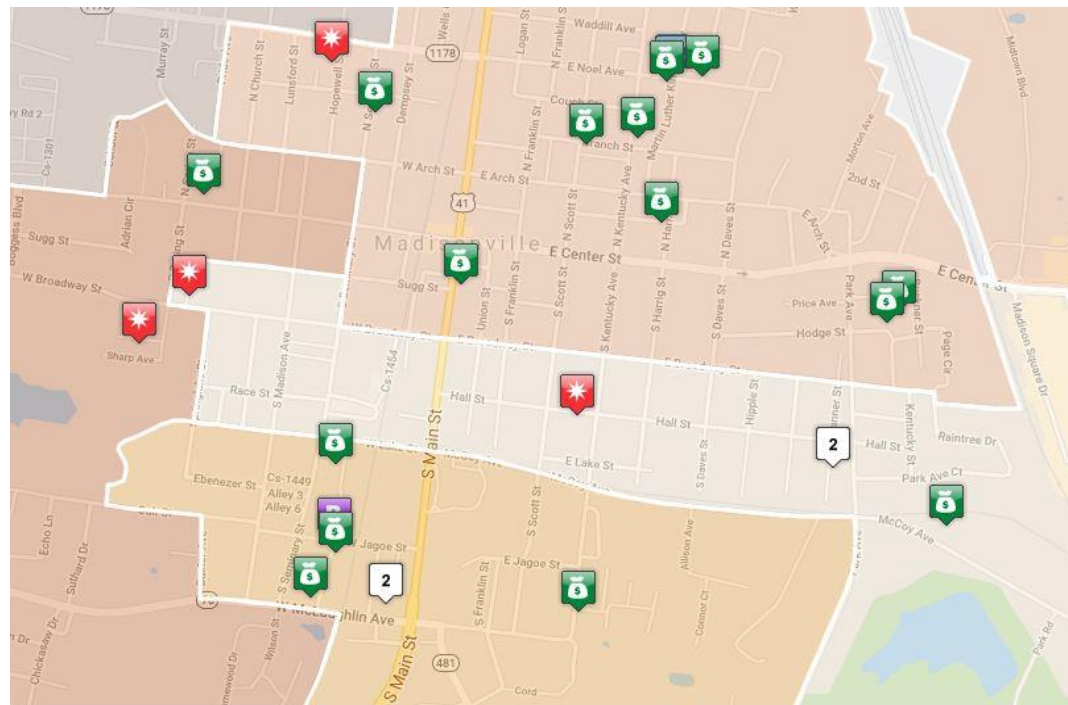

Part 1 Crimes Highest Density



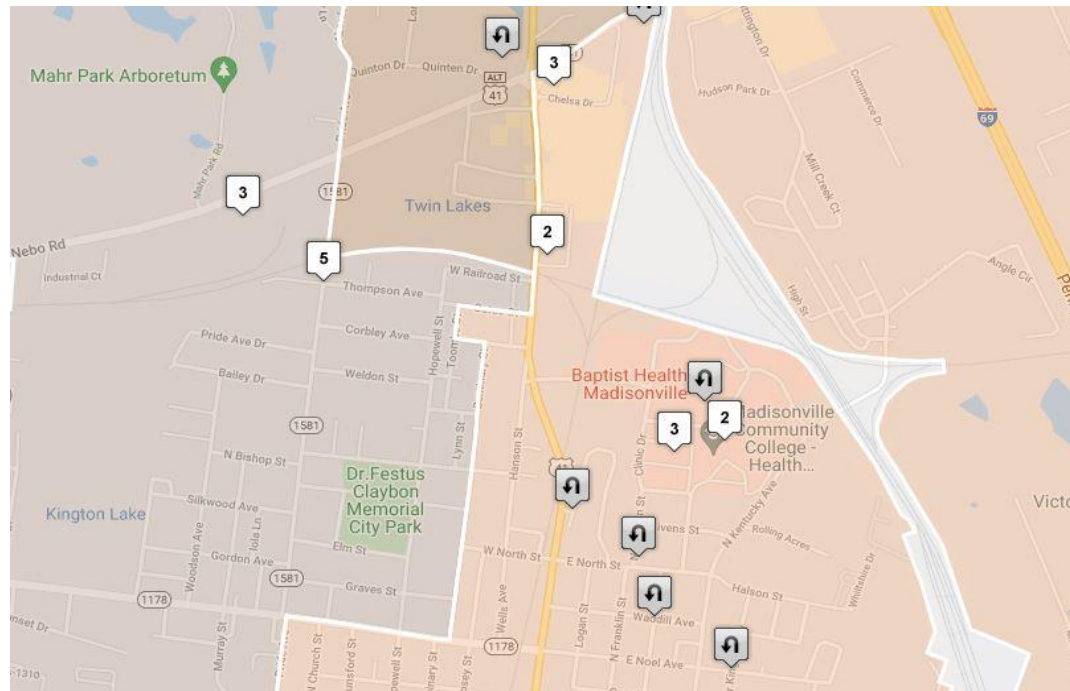

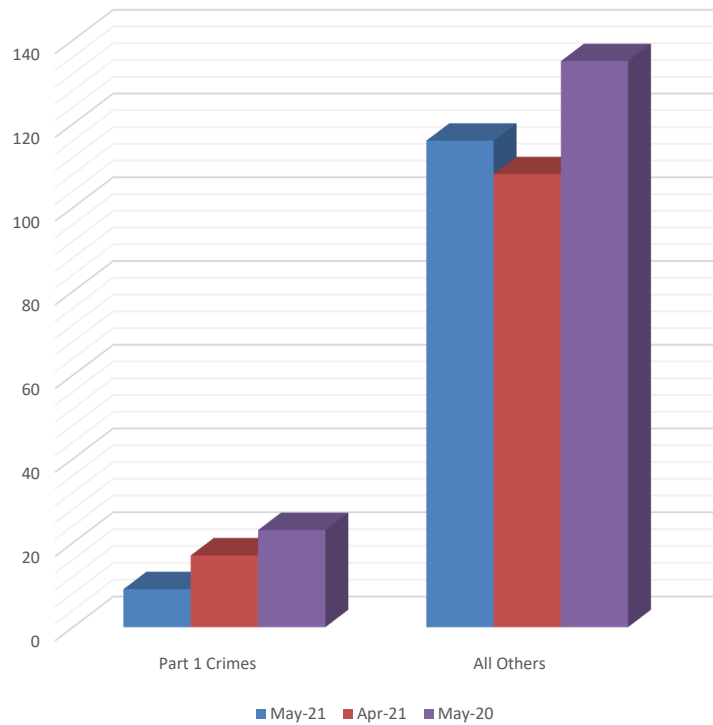

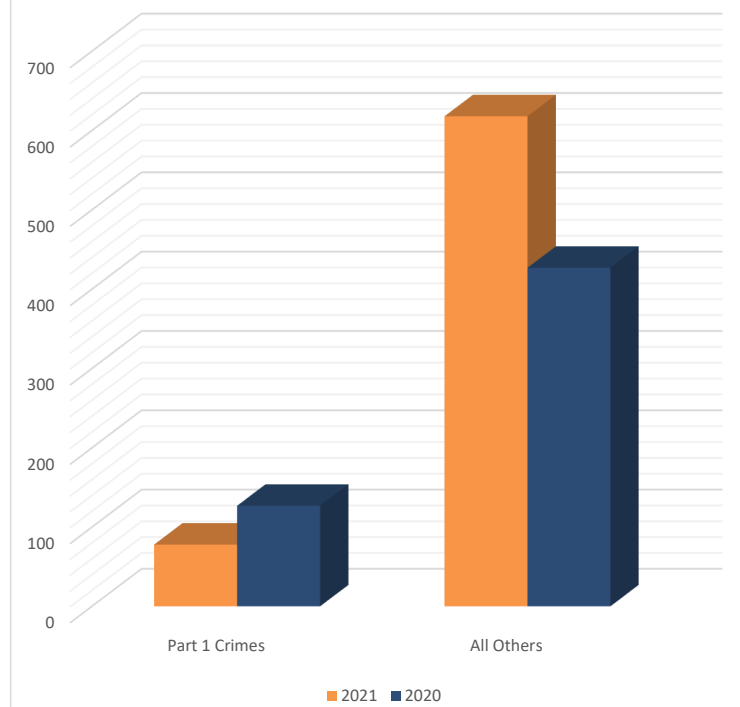

ORDINANCE O-2021-6**

**AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ACCEPTANCE OF A PUBLIC STREET, ALLEY OR
LANE AND AUTHORIZING THE CLOSING OF SAME**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF MADISONVILLE, KY, AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, the following described street, alley or lane has been dedicated as a public street, alley or lane by specific reference thereto by deeds of record in the Hopkins County Court Clerk's Office; and

WHEREAS, the City of Madisonville desires to accept the dedication of said street, alley or lane so that same may be legally closed as herein provided; and

WHEREAS, all property owners who abut the public street, alley or lane have consented in writing to the proposed closing of the street, alley or lane; and

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City of Madisonville, Kentucky, that dedication of the following described street, alley or lane is hereby accepted by the City of Madisonville, and the following findings of fact are made with reference thereto:

1. The particular street, alley or lane to be closed is a 30 foot right of way identified as Hickman Lane as same appears on the plat of record in Cabinet 2, Slide 1, Hopkins County Court Clerk's Office, extending from Brown Road to the railroad which is highlighted in yellow on the attached plat.

2. All property owners in or abutting the street, alley or lane to be closed are as follows:

a. ST Development, LLC by virtue of a deed of conveyance executed by MSM Properties, LLC and of record in Deed Book 760, page 694, Hopkins County Court Clerk's Office, and by virtue of a deed of conveyance executed by Dean Sheets Properties, LLC and of record in Deed Book 760, page 697, Hopkins County Court Clerk's Office.

b. David E. Garrigan and his wife, Mary E. Garrigan, and Jerry L. Rickard and his wife, Vendonna Rickard, by virtue of a deed of conveyance executed by L. Rush Hunt, Master Commissioner and of record in Deed Book 760, page 671, Hopkins County Court Clerk's Office.

c. Jackie Ray French and his wife, Sandra French, by virtue of a deed of conveyance executed by Madisonville-Hopkins County Economic Development Corporation and of record in Deed Book 621, page 57, Hopkins County Court Clerk's

Office, and by virtue of a deed of conveyance executed by Gary E. Peyton, et ux., and of record in Deed Book 771, page 213, Hopkins County Court Clerk's Office.

3. Written notice of the proposed closing was given to all property owners in or abutting the public street, alley or lane being closed; and

4. All property owners in or abutting the public street, alley or lane being closed have given their written notarized consent to the closing and copies of the written consents are attached hereto.

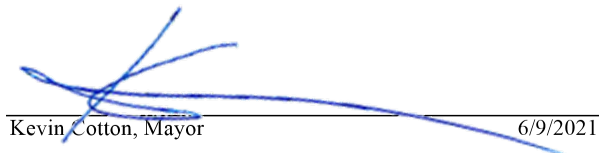

- (A) Amended General Fund revenues include a \$320,000 increase in grant revenues.
- (B) Police Department expenses increased by \$200,000 for the purchase of grant funded dispatch center equipment.
- (C) Airport expenses increased by \$120,000 due to grant funded facility improvements.
- (D) Municipal Aid Fund revenues increased by \$237,000 due to special discretionary funds received from the state.
The increase in Municipal Aid expenses is for additional street paving which was funded by the discretionary monies.
- (E) Amended Restaurant Tax Fund revenues include a tax revenue increase of \$240,000 and \$340,000 in local organizations contributions.
Restaurant Tax Fund expenses increased by \$580,000 for projects including Grapevine Bike Trails, Nature Park Playground, and Sports Complex funding.
- (F) Amended Sanitation Fund revenues increased by \$250,000 due to a rate increase that took place during the fiscal year. The increase in Sanitation Fund expenses of \$250,000 is for operating costs.

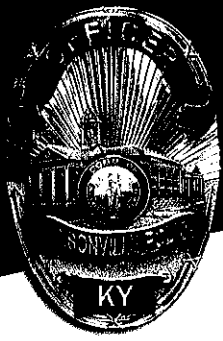
