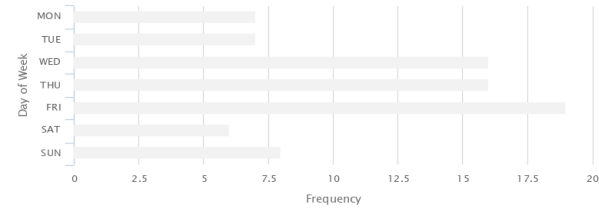

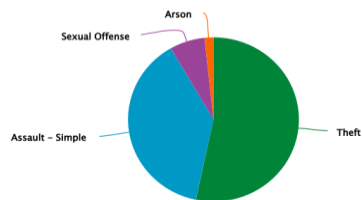
Part 1 Crimes by Day of Week



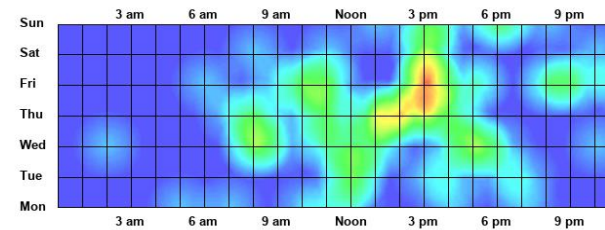
Traffic Accidents by Day of Week

Traffic Accident Highest Times



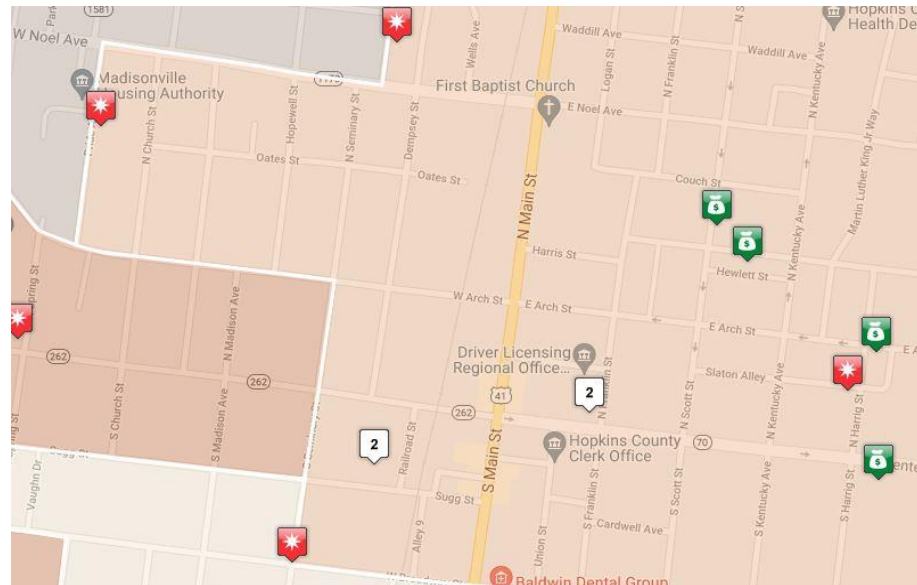

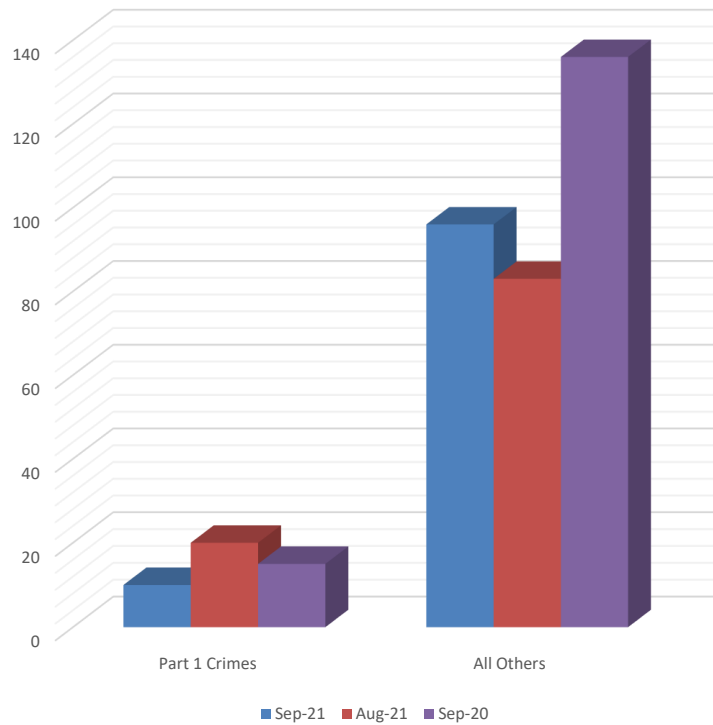

Projected Sign Authorization for Mad Axes

In accordance with the City's Sign Regulations, all suspending/projecting signs overhanging a city sidewalk/right-of-way must receive Council approval prior to the issuance of a sign permit. Any such sign must have a minimum of 8' clearance from the bottom edge of the sign to the pavement/sidewalk and may not project out more than 7' from the building nor extend closer than 2' to the edge of the curb. In addition, the applicant must submit proof of liability insurance naming the City as an insured party.

Recently, the Zoning Administrator received a request for a projecting sign from Hoard Signs for a new business, Mad Axes owned by JP Wilson, going in 25B South Main which is above Anytime Fitness. The proposed sign will be 4' high x 5' wide and meets all the required criteria as mentioned above.

Proof of liability insurance has been received and a Certificate of Appropriateness has also been received and will be reviewed by the Historic District Commission.

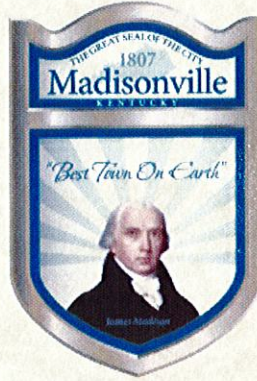
